

Can I bring lithium battery packs to Malta

Can a lithium battery start a fire at Malta Airport?

The attached document issued by Malta Airport Security is for guidance purposes only. Note the distinction between prohibited items in hand luggage and prohibited items in hold luggage. Lithium batteries are found in most of our devices, and that if they're short circuited or damaged, they can start a fire.

Can you travel with lithium batteries?

However, with proper preparation and knowledge of the rules, it is possible to travel internationally with your electronic devices powered by these batteries. When packing for your trip, make sure to keep your lithium batteries in their original packaging or use battery cases that are designed for travel purposes.

Can lithium batteries be transported by air?

There are different limitations and requirements when the lithium batteries are transported by air as cargo or carried by passengers. However, limitations primarily depend on: the lithium metal content in grams (g) for lithium metal (non-rechargeable) batteries.

Are lithium batteries safe to ship?

Improperly packaged lithium batteries can ignite, causing fires that are difficult to extinguish and pose a significant risk to the safety of transportation workers and the general public. Other battery types, such as alkaline or nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), are generally considered safer to ship.

Can you bring a lithium battery on a plane?

The International Civil Aviation Organization has set guidelines for transporting lithium batteries on airplanes, but individual countries may have their own regulations that go beyond these guidelines. For example, in China, you are only allowed to bring one spare battery with a maximum capacity of 160Wh on planes.

Why are lithium batteries regulated?

Lithium batteries are highly regulated because of their potential to cause fires. These batteries store a large amount of energy, and if they short-circuit or overheat, they can ignite the materials around them. This has led to several high-profile incidents in recent years.
