What is the new electricity tariff in Peninsular Malaysia?

PHOTO: THE STAR PETALING JAYA - Starting next July, the base electricity tariff in Peninsular Malaysia will be raised by 14.2% to 45.62 sen per kilowatt-hour (kWh), along with a new tariff schedule. The change will take place under the three-year Regulatory Period 4 (RP4) that will be effective from Jan 2025 to Dec 2027.

What is the electricity price in Malaysia?

The residential electricity price in Malaysia is MYR 0.221 per kWh or USD 0.052. The electricity price for businesses is MYR 0.568 kWh or USD 0.135. These retail prices were collected in December 2024 and include the cost of power, distribution and transmission, and all taxes and fees. Compare Malaysia with 150 other countries.

Is Tenaga adjusting the base electricity tariff in Malaysia?

To recap, Tenaga Nasional Bhd (KL: TENAGA), which operates the power grid in Peninsular Malaysia, announced on Dec 26 a proposed adjustment of the base electricity tariff to 45.62 sen/kWh in the fourth regulatory period (RP4, from 2025 to 2027) from 39.95 sen/kWh in RP3 (from 2022 to 2024).

Why is Malaysia rebasing its base electricity tariff in 2025-2027?

KUALA LUMPUR (Dec 27): The proposed adjustment in Peninsular Malaysia's base electricity tariff under the Regulatory Period 2025-2027 (RP4) is mainly a "rebased exercise" to reflect higher fuel costs assumption, said Tenaga Nasional Bhd (KL: TENAGA).

Is Malaysia using electricity at a low cost?

The Malaysian public is currently using electricity at below costs, which are covered by the government's coffers as well as some contributions from the power plant operators to the Electricity Industry Fund, or KWIE.

What are the business electricity rates in Malaysia?

Business electricity rates in Malaysia are 83.35% of the world average price and 121.23% of the average in Asia. Household rates are 38.91% of the business rates. Electricity prices paid by small businesses in Malaysia are 81.51% of the prices paid by big businesses.
