Where are Canadian Army bases located?

Army bases are grouped into "divisional" commands. These include the 1st Canadian Division, headquartered in Kingston, Ontario, the 2nd Canadian Division located in various parts of Quebec, the 3rd Canadian Division in western Canada, the 4th Canadian Division in Ontario and the 5th Canadian Division in Atlantic Canada.

What is the difference between a Canadian Forces base and a station?

Canadian Forces Bases (CFBs) are the homes of the operational units of the Canadian Armed Forces. Bases also provide housing and support services to Armed Forces members and their families. Canadian Forces Stations (CFSs) are smaller than bases and usually have minor operational units, but little or no support function.

What are the Canadian Armed Forces bases and support units?

Canadian Armed Forces bases and support units: 5th Canadian Division Support Base Gagetown (Army, New Brunswick), Canadian Forces Base Bagotville (Air Force, Quebec), Canadian Forces Base Borden (Army, Ontario), Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake (Air Force, Alberta), and 23 more rows.

What does a Canadian military base do?

These bases provide essential support services. Bases are home to many units and formations within the Canadian Armed Forces. For example, bases house brigade groups, regiments and military police. Bases can also serve as training facilities and provide support services for on-base military personnel.

What is a Canadian Forces Station?

Minor installations are named Canadian Forces station or CFS (French: station des Forces canadiennes, SFC). A Canadian Forces station could host a single minor unit (e.g., an early-warning radar station). Many of these facilities are now decommissioned for administrative purposes and function as detachments of a larger Canadian Forces base nearby.

How many military bases are there in Canada?

There are 10 Army bases, located in Quebec, western, central and Atlantic Canada. These bases provide essential support services and are an important part of the Canadian Army. CFB Suffield is a military base in southeastern Alberta.

The Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) maintains a number of major bases and operating stations on the Atlantic and Pacific coasts, as well as in the St. Lawrence River, Great Lakes and major navigable inland waterways such as Lake of the Woods, Lake Winnipeg, and Great Slave Lake/Mackenzie River. Currently, there are no vessels permanently based in the eastern Arctic, altho...
